

**Dr. Neil Charness**



Dr. Neil Charness is [William G. Chase Professor of Psychology](#), Director of the [Institute for Successful Longevity](#) and Associate Director of the University Transportation Center (Accessibility and Safety for an Aging Population ([ASAP](#))) at Florida State University. He received his BA from McGill University (1969) and MSc and PhD from Carnegie Mellon University (1971, 1974) in Psychology. Prior to coming to Florida State University he was on the faculty at Wilfrid Laurier University and the University of Waterloo in Canada. Neil's current research focuses on human

factors approaches to age and technology use, interventions to promote improved cognition, and aging driver and pedestrian safety. He is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association (APA), the Association for Psychological Science, and the Gerontological Society of America. He received the [Jack A. Kraft](#) Innovator award (with [CREATE](#) colleagues) from the Human Factors & Ergonomics Society (2013); the [Franklin V. Taylor Award](#) for Outstanding Contributions in the field of Applied Experimental and Engineering Psychology from Division 21 of APA (2016); the [M. Powell Lawton award](#) for Distinguished Contribution to Applied Gerontology from Division 20 of APA (2016), the APA Prize for [Interdisciplinary Team Research](#) with CREATE colleagues (2016), was honored as a Grandmaster of the [International Society for Gerontechnology](#) (2018), and received APA's Committee on Aging award for the [Advancement of Psychology and Aging](#) (2018).
