Tracy P. Moyé began her legal career over thirty years ago as a Lieutenant in the United States Navy where she prosecuted and defended felony cases including conspiracy and double homicide. After serving five years in the Navy, Mrs. Moyé returned to Florida where she began a career of public service. First she prosecuted cases of severe child abuse terminating the parental rights of abusive parents. She then served with the State of Florida, Department of Environmental Protection where she represented the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund (The Governor and Cabinet) in major land litigation throughout the State. In 1999, Mrs. Moyé entered private practice where she has represented neighborhoods and persons whose land has been injured by environmental contamination. Mrs. Moyé has expanded her practice to include representation of the elderly and disabled in matters of abuse and contested guardianships.

Mrs. Moyé also has a personal interest in preserving the dignity and protecting the rights of the developmentally disabled. She was a founding member of WAVE, a non-profit organization devoted to advancing the social and employment opportunities for adults with developmental disabilities in Leon County. She has also served as a mentor in public schools, a tutor for the learning disabled, and a booster for the Rickard's Raiders football, track and cross country programs. Additionally, Tracy devotes her Sunday mornings to playing the piano at her church.

Tracy is member of the Environmental and Elder Law Sections of the Florida Bar and the Florida Justice Association. She also serves on the board of the Tallahassee Women Lawyers.
